In June 2013, the Trudeau Foundation inaugurated a partnership with Goodenough College of London, the United Kingdom. Goodenough College is London's leading residential college for international postgraduates. It provides accommodation in the heart of Bloomsbury for 700 students from all over the world; 20% of students come with their families. Selection is based not only on applicants' academic prowess but also on their commitment and enthusiasm to contribute to the life of this unique academic community and, later, to their home countries. Goodenough College has enduring ties with Commonwealth countries and Canada in particular: Canadians annually comprise the largest national cohort, with around 10% of the College's membership.

Membership at Goodenough: Long Stays

Under the terms of the partnership, Goodenough College offers automatic membership to Trudeau scholars studying in London, subject to a veto only in the most exceptional circumstances. Goodenough hopes that the scholars take up College membership for one or more years, since this maximizes the benefits of living in Goodenough's academic community. However, where possible, the College will try to accommodate scholars wishing to stay for a shorter period.

To apply for membership at the College, Trudeau scholars must complete the online application form at <u>www.goodenough.ac.uk</u>. Scholars need not provide references and an essay, but should simply indicate that they are Trudeau scholars and attach a copy of their award letter from the Foundation. Please also attach a short biography that the institution will use to present you to its members. Short Stays at Goodenough

Less than one year. Goodenough has some student rooms and flats (apartments) available for periods of less than one year. Scholars, mentors, fellows, directors, and members of the Foundation should send their dates to Caroline Persaud, the college registrar, directly at <u>caroline.persaud@goodenough.ac.uk</u>. Their requests will be prioritized.

Hotel accommodation. The Goodenough Club is the College's four-star rated hotel accommodation. It is situated on the College campus and it shares the College's facilities. Members of the Trudeau
